## Snow Plowing



With at least two more months of snow to look forward to here's the scoop on snow removal in Teton.

Plowing of streets is normally done once there is 2" - 4" of accumulation. Plowing will start between the hours of 2:00 a.m. and 5:00 a.m. and will typically run no later than 12:00 noon.

Residents are reminded that it is NOT the City's responsibility to plow driveways; however, if there are no obstructions, such as garbage cans or vehicles, in the way, every effort will be made to clear driveways adjacent to the city street.
